Temporary power disconnection

For safety reasons, it may be necessary to temporarily disconnect your power if a tree being pruned or removed is too close to your home's service wires. If so, you will be notified when the disconnection is expected to take place and how long it will last.

When a property owner or a private contractor plans to conduct tree pruning or removal near electric lines and equipment, it's important to remember that safety guidelines may require a temporary power disconnection.
