PIERCE PEPIN CARES GRANTS BENEFIT FOOD PANTRIES AND MORE

Thanks to the generosity of PPCS members participating in the Operation Round Up program, eight area food pantries can stock their shelves to benefit local residents this holiday season. The Pierce County Food Pantry, Pepin County Food Pantry, Our Saviors Lutheran Church, Prescott Area Food Pantry, River Falls Food Pantry, Spring Valley Community Food Pantry, Elmwood Food Pantry, Plum City Food Pantry, and Pepin—Immanuel Evangelical Lutheran were each awarded \$2,200 through the program, for a total of \$17,600 to local food pantries.

Pierce Pepin Cares grants were also awarded to the Landmark Conservancy (\$250) for protection of an eight-mile segment of the Chippewa River State Trail, Lost Creek Ranch Therapeutic Riding & Horse Rescue (\$500) to assist with operating costs, Heart (\$1,000) to purchase necessities for families in need, Our Neighbors Place (\$1,000) to support gaps in service following the closure of Assistance & Resource Center (ARC), and Ellsworth Fire Department (\$1,000) for a battery-powered cut-off saw.

These donations are made possible by PPCS members who "round up" their electric bills each month to the nearest dollar or donate a specific amount. PPCS employees also host annual fundraisers to help fund Pierce Pepin Cares. PREPARE NOW FOR WINTER STORMS

It's hard to predict the weather, but it's leasy to prepare for it. Here's how to plan for unavoidable power outages that can accompany winter storms.

- Listen to weather forecasts daily so you'll know when high winds, heavy snow, or ice are coming. This kind of winter weather is most likely to affect power lines.
- Prepare an outage kit that contains a battery-powered radio, fresh batteries, a flashlight, candles, matches, a wind-up clock, bottled water, paper plates, and plastic utensils.
- Keep a stock of canned food in your cupboard, along with a manual can

- opener. Consider buying a camp stove and fuel that you can use (outdoors only, please) if you can't cook on your electric stove.
- Pile a few extra blankets and sweaters together so you can find them easily if the heat goes off. Dress in layers to stay warm.
- Teach children to stay away from fallen or sagging power lines. Even if the power is out, they could be energized and dangerous.
- Sign up for SmartHub and download the app to your smartphone or tablet.
 You can report power outages through SmartHub or by calling 800-927-5705.



We hope the weather will cooperate, so we don't have any significant outages this winter. If we do, know that PPCS is prepared to restore service as quickly as possible.







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
